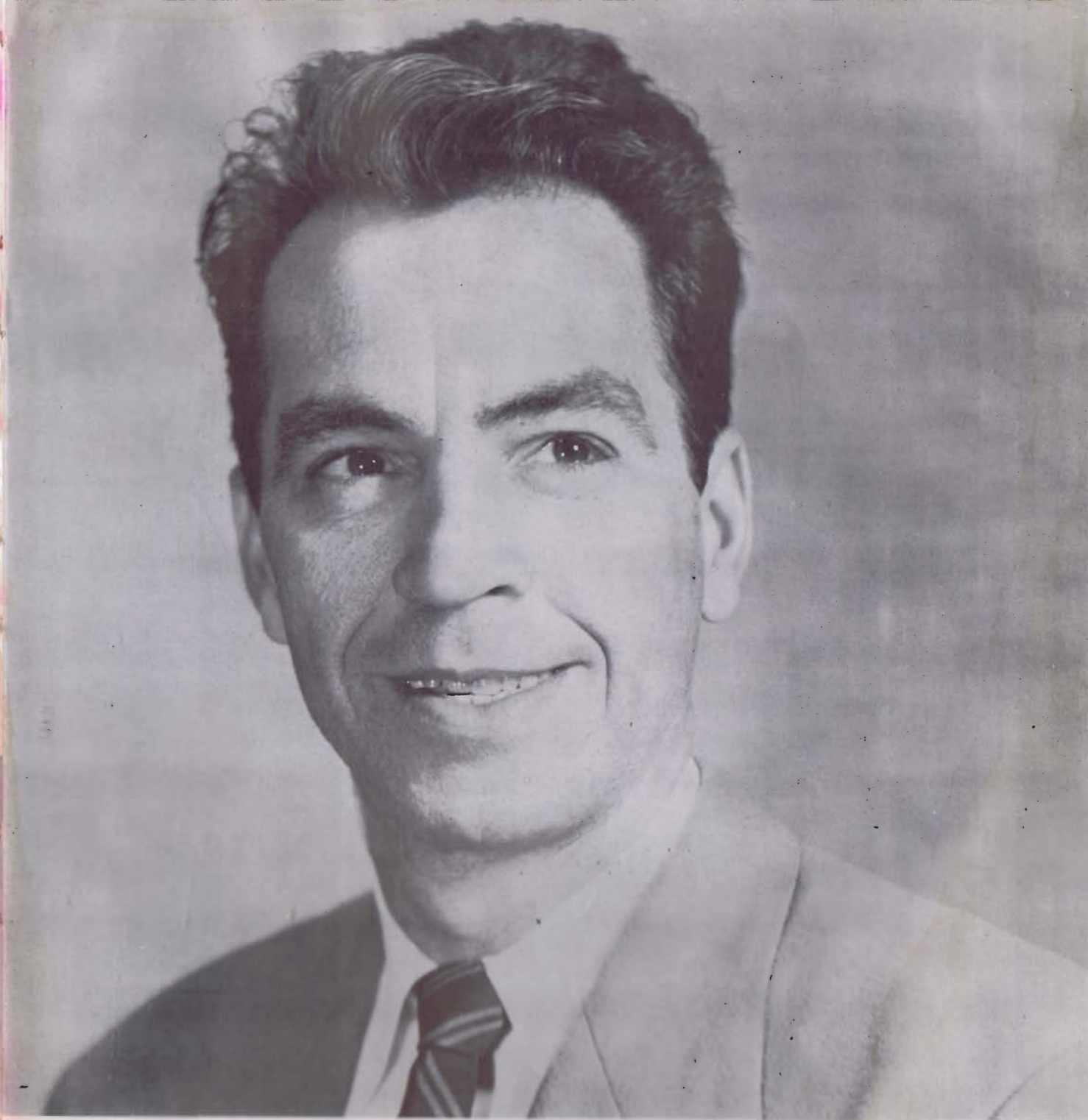

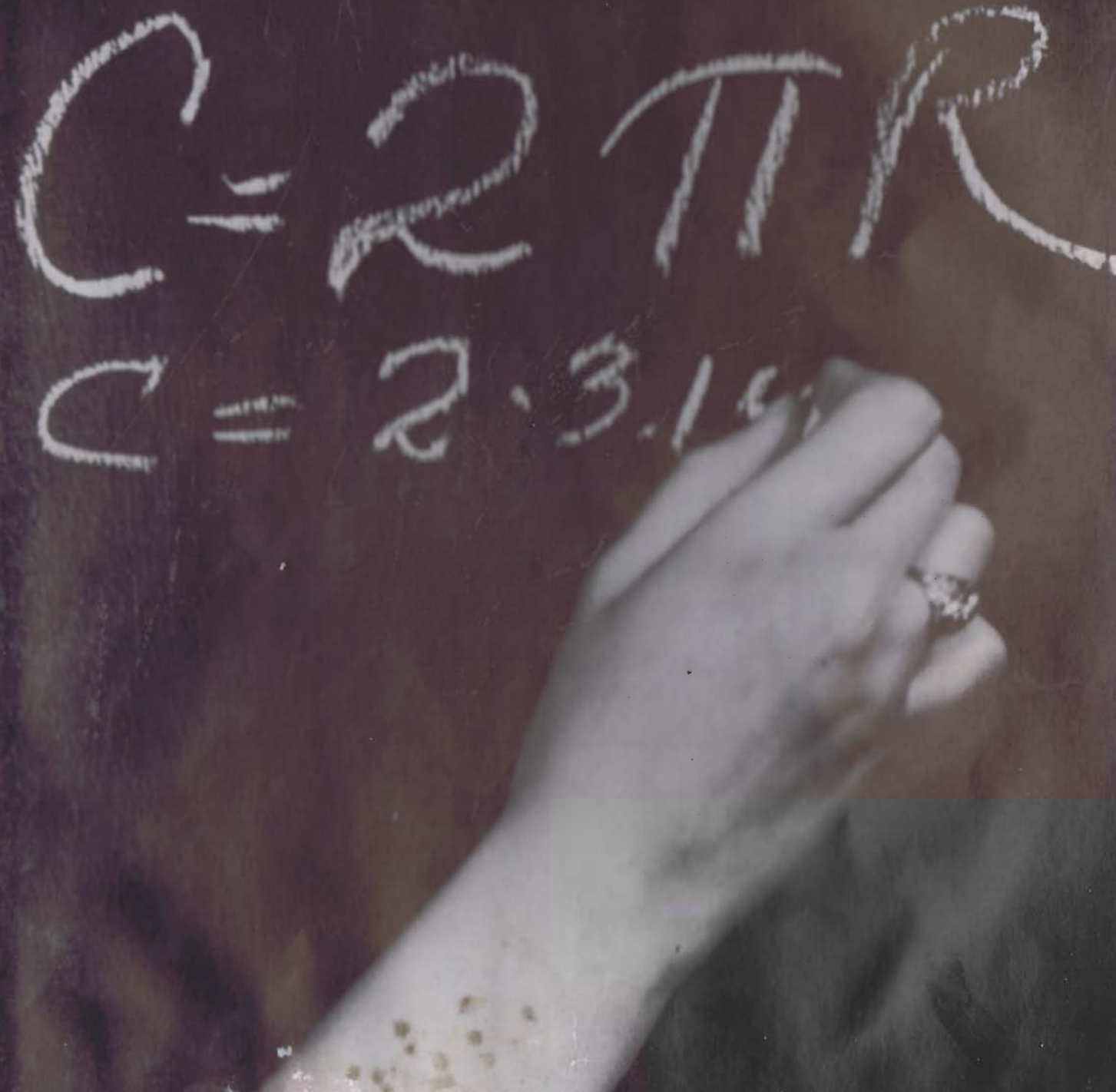
FOREWORD
