ANN MCKINLEY

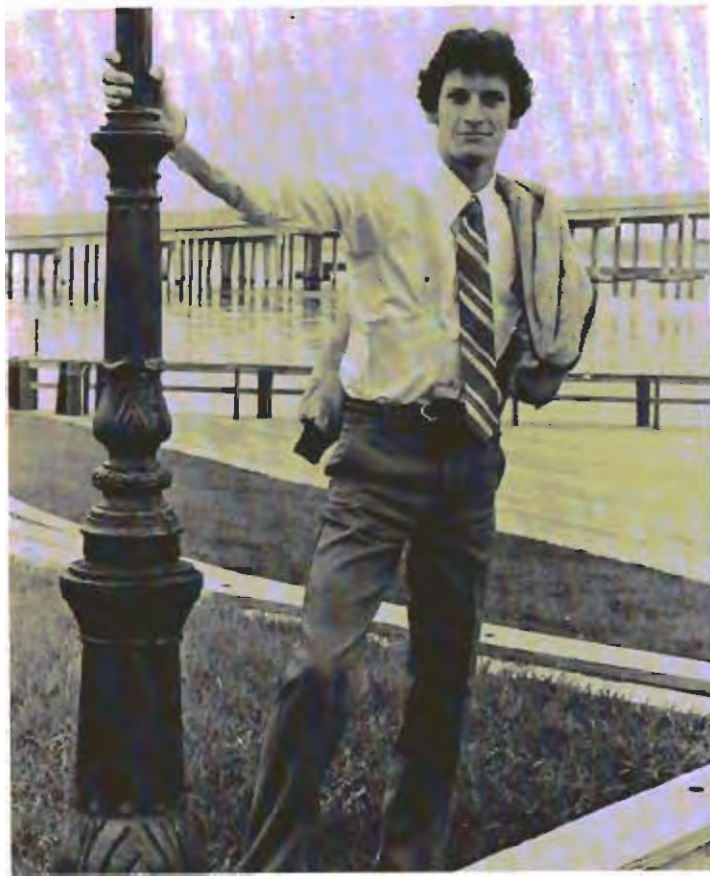

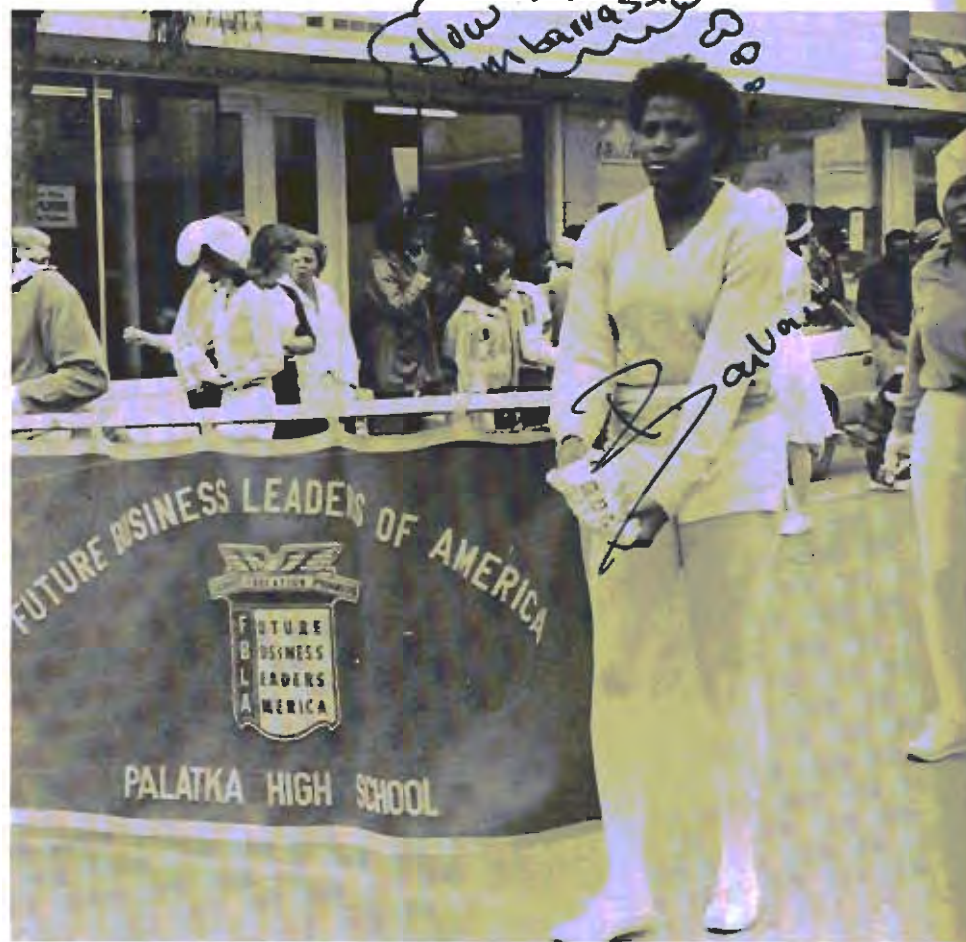

FCA's chief goal is to help students with the problems of teenage life. In the future FCA / FCS would like to see you.

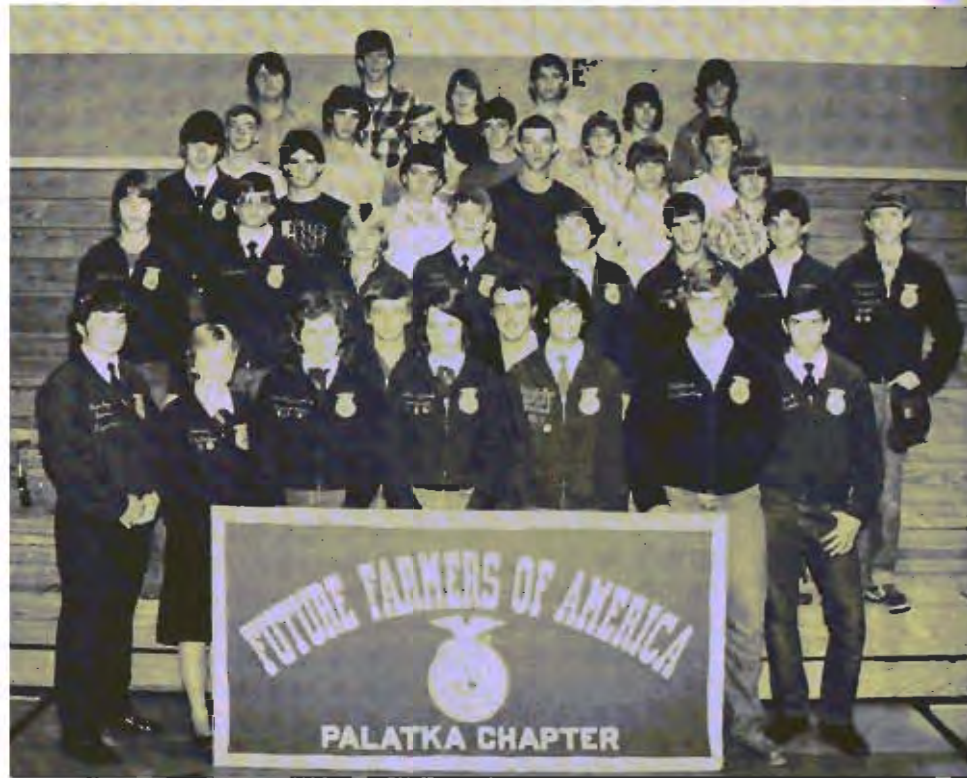

The district 4 Class 3-A state Champs traveled to Gainesville to take on the No. 3-ranked purple Hurricanes of GHS. The Panthers were ignited by an excellent performance by fullback Joe Brinson with 103 yards on eleven carries and with a touchdown ramble of 57 yards. The Panthers' ground and air attack flooded the strong Gainesville defense with more problems than they could handle. The Panthers rushed 39 times for 242 yards and passed for 111 yards. 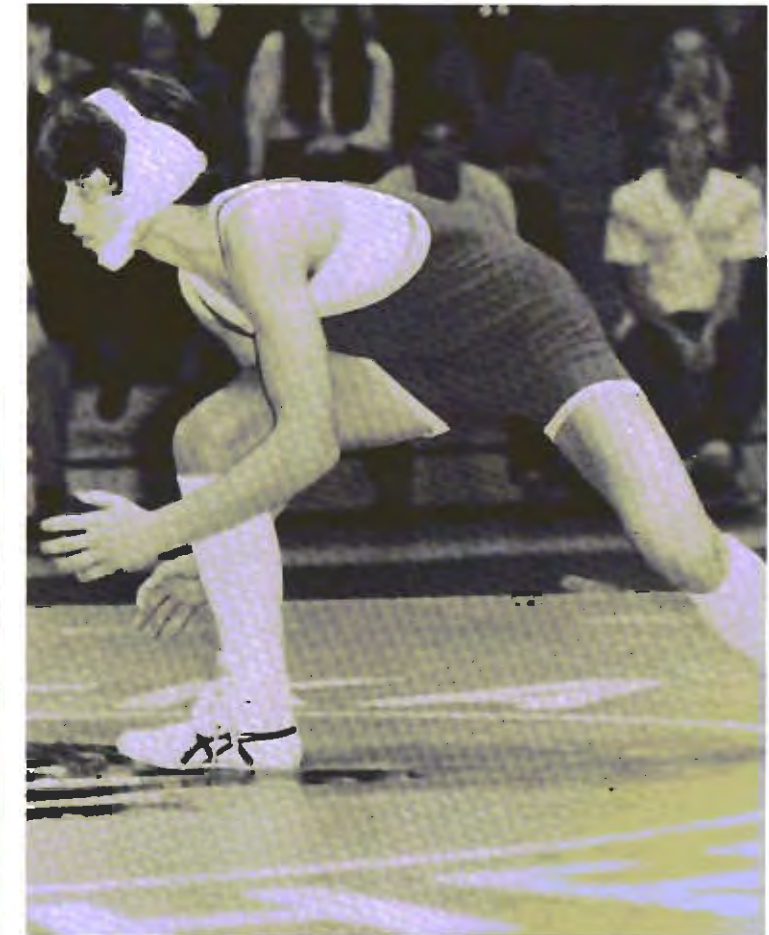

The Junior ROTC Program was initiated at Palatka Senior High School, later designated as Palatka South High School, in 1969. Until the establishment of Palatka High School, students from Palatka Central High School could be cross-enrolled in the program. The program was opened to female students in 1974.

Although enrollment in JROTC does not incur a military obligation in any, about half of the graduated cadets who completed one or more years of JROTC

have entered the Armed Forces. Seven of these have received commissioning programs, including Army and Navy Senior ROTC, the U.S. Air Force Academy, and U.S. Naval Academy.

For those cadets who do not enter the Armed Forces, JROTC offers training in leadership, citizenship, and communications skills which can prove of value in any civilian career.

The JROTC Battalion is composed of Battalion Headquarters, three cadet companies, male and female color

guards, and male and female drill teams. Extracurricular activities also include the Ranger Platoon and the Rifle Team, although rifle firing has been temporarily suspended. Major Activities include color guard, drill team, and rifle team competitions at state level, field training exercises, adventure training in rope rappelling, overnight exercises for the Ranger Platoon, the annual formal inspection, the annual cookout at Gold Head Branch State Park, and Awards Night.
