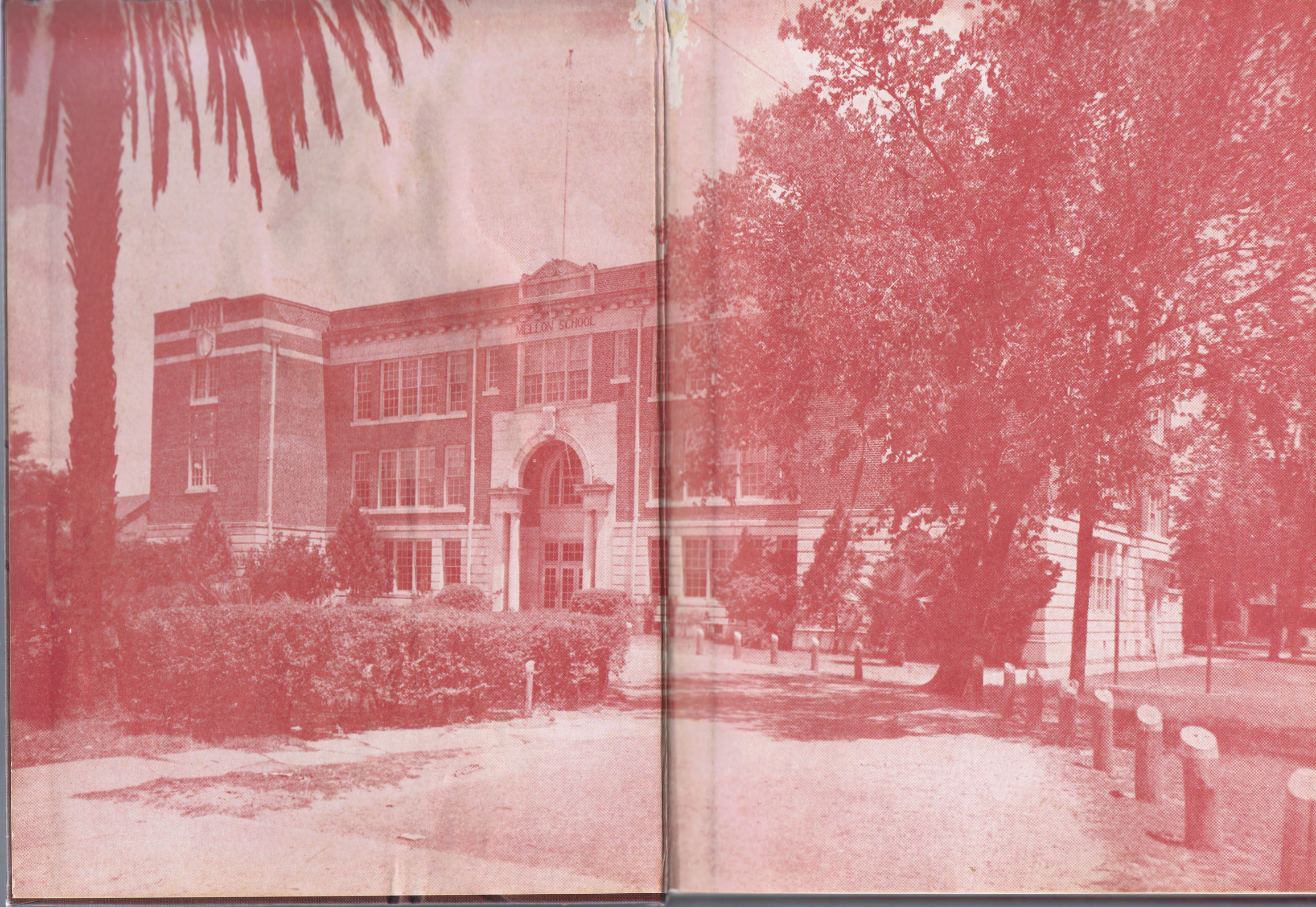

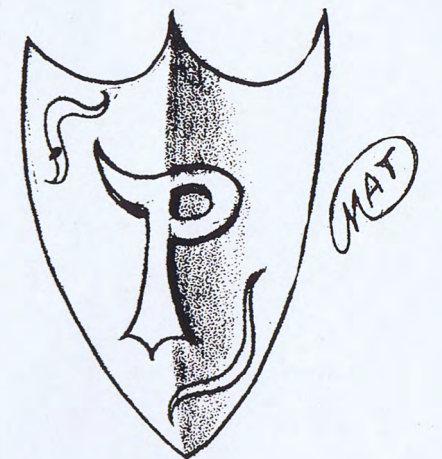

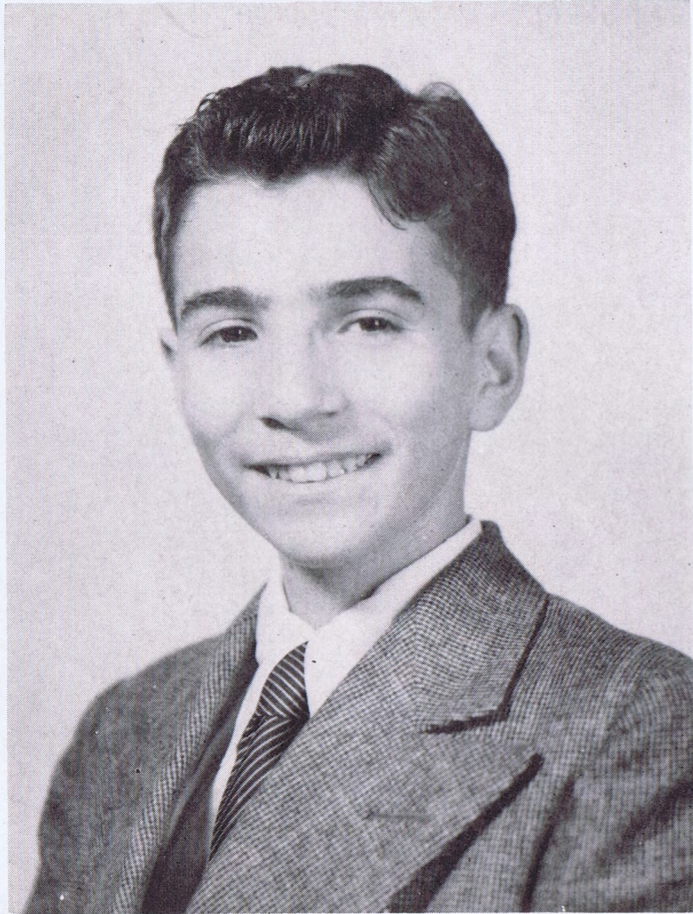
We seniors realize that we spent many of our school days in a "daze," but we feel that through it all we have emerged with flying colors as would be "knights" of Putnam High.

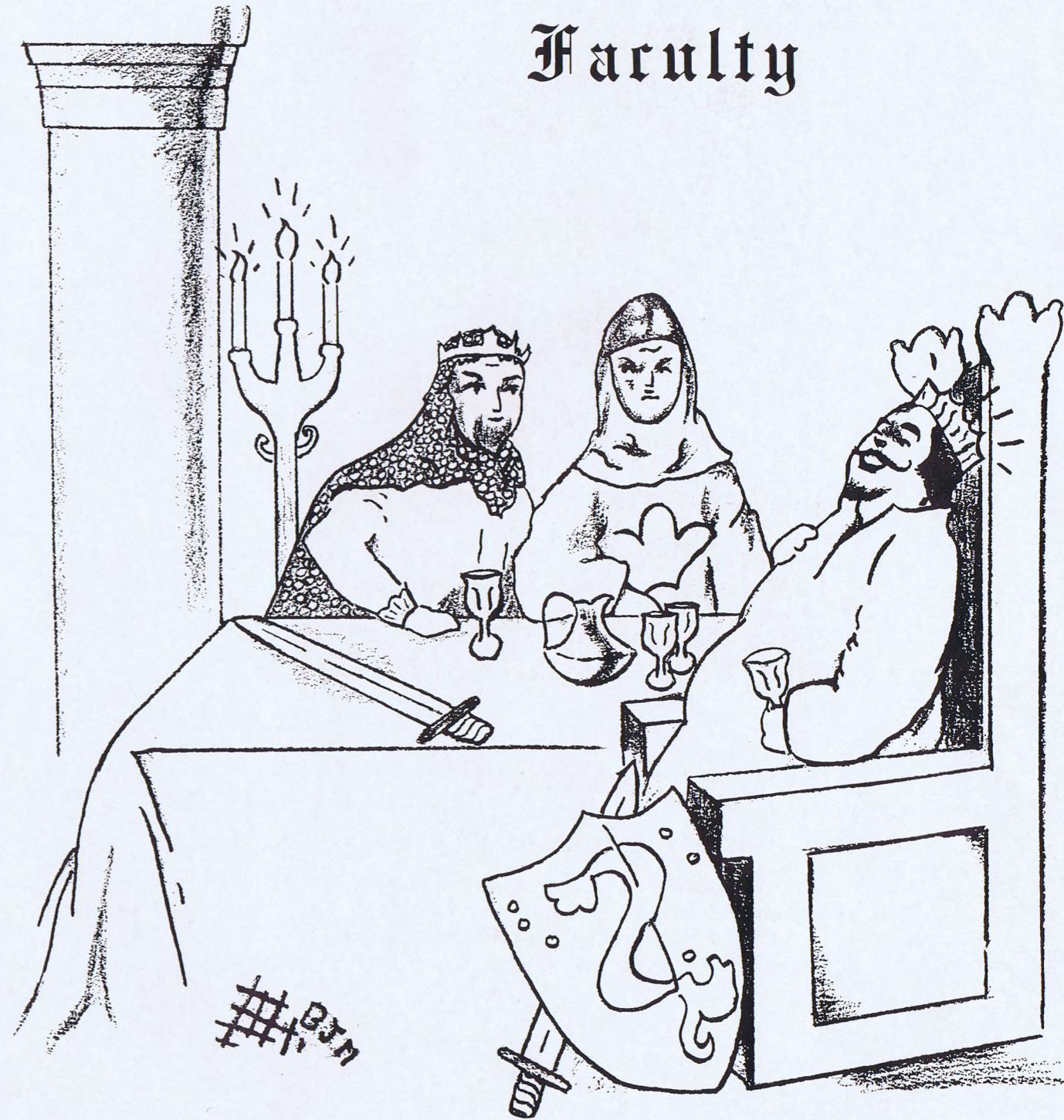

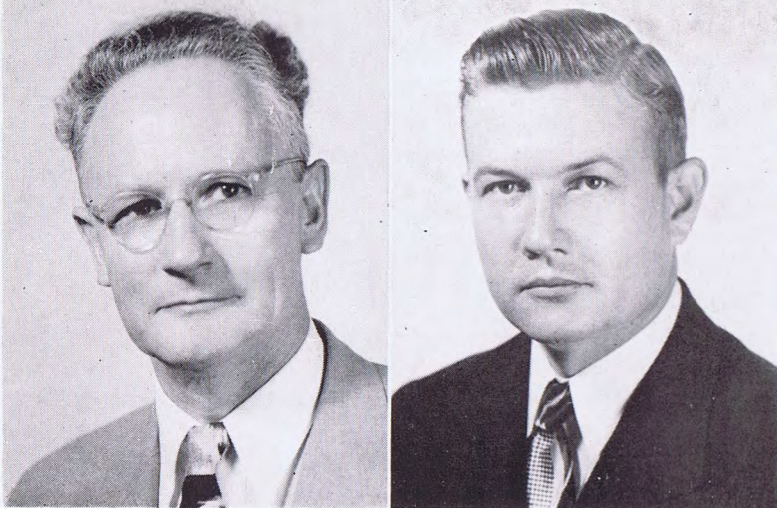
Remember

L. points, he is eligible to receive advanced N. F. L. degrees of Honor, Excellence and Distinction. The degree held by the member is indicated through proper jewelery of his N. F. L. key: emerald for Degree of Honor, blue sapphire for Degree of Excellence, and ruby for Degree of Distinction.
