Race

The people listed on the 1850 census were all white except for 8 listed as mulatto and 2 listed as free black since this was during the days of slavery.

The **Slave Schedule** listed twenty-six men as slave-holders. One man had 50 slaves. Another had 31; four had between 11 and 17, and the rest had less than ten. Four had only one slave each and four had two slaves each.

In the **male category**, eighteen were listed as slaves under 5, fifteen—between 5 and 10; ten—between 11 and 15; twenty—between 16 and 20; twenty—between 21 and 30; eleven—between 31 and 45, and four—over 45 years of age.

In the **female category**, sixteen were listed as under 5; eleven—between 5 and 10; eight—between 11 and 15; twelve—between 16 and 20; twenty—between 21 and 30; eleven—between 31 and 45, and four—over 45 years of age.

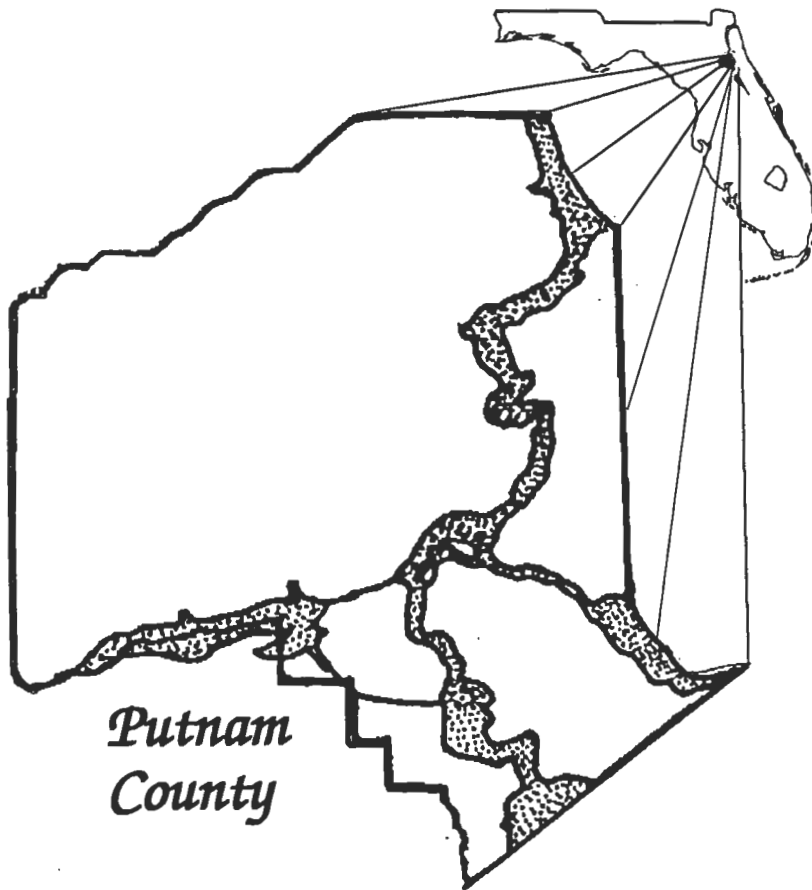

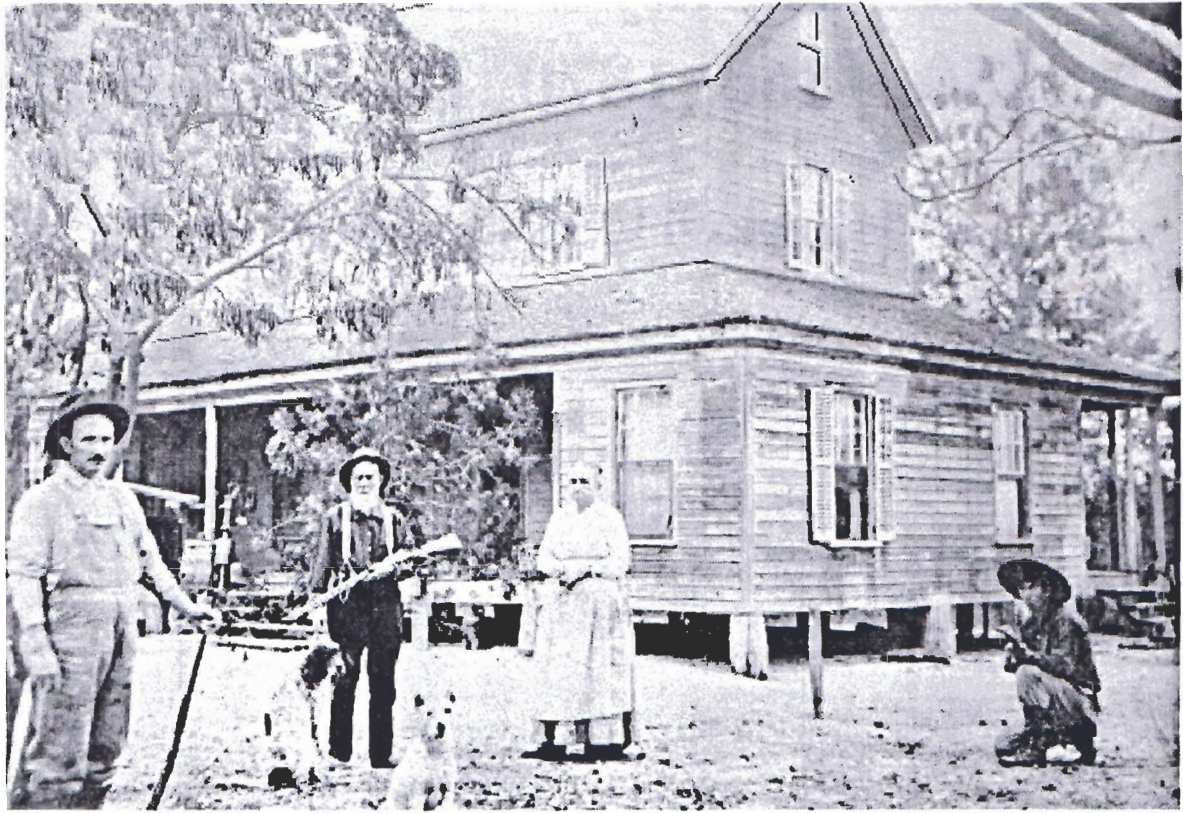

Life in Rural Putnam County

C.C. Alvers, poses with his parents, William Cone and Margaret Dean Alvers, and Bill Frossard at the Alvers home in Sisco, Florida. Born February 22, 1842 in Alachua County, Florida, William Cone Alvarez became Alvers during the Civil War when the paymaster changed his name. Captured at Missionary Ridge, Tennessee, he was imprisoned at Rock Island, Illinois until the end of the war. As many soldiers, both Union and Confederates, did following the war, he walked back home, and in November 1865, he met and married Margaret Dean, who was living in Duval county. With his wife and her family, he returned to Putnam County where his sons, Oliver and C.C. were born in the 1870s.

Named for Benjamin Alexander Putnam, speaker of the Florida House of Representatives in 1848, Putnam County was created from parts of Alachua, Orange, Marion, Duval and St. Johns Counties on January 13, 1849. This series of books contains the census reports for this county and was undertaken at the conclusion of the Florida Sesquicentennial in 1995 as a project to help Putnam County celebrate its sesquicentennial in 1999.

This project was a cooperative endeavor between myself and Janice Mahaffey, archivist for Putnam County. For over four years we have transcribed all of the census reports since the formation of the county through 1920, the last census available under the Privacy Act which prevents the release of records for a period of seventy-five years.

This has been a time-consuming project. I have spent hours each day transcribing census and marriage reports, and many more hours were spent with Janice Mahaffey at the Putnam County Archives proofreading the manuscript. Book 1 contains all the census reports in the nineteenth century – 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880, and 1885. Book 2 lists the 1900 census report; Book 3, 1910 and Book 4, 1920. In each book, following the census reports, we have included a chapter containing the marriages which occurred during that period.

*To err is human
To forgive divine.*

We know there will be errors. We have diligently endeavored to make each page as accurate and as nearly like the original page as possible. One change we made was to emphasize the family name using capital letters printed in bold characters. The 1885 census listed the last name of each person. We listed the last name of the head of the household only for readability.

We encourage the reader to use the index to find persons of importance to the reader and photocopy those pages. Then we recommend that the reader go to the library and use the page number on the page from our book to locate and print the original page on the appropriate reel of microfilm that contains the Putnam County census reports. The reader may have personal knowledge which may correct any incorrect assumptions we had to make.

Census reports were completed by enumerators who went from door to door gathering information from some person in the household. At times these persons gave erroneous information. If a family was not at home, the enumerator may not have been able to contact them and they may not be listed on the census.

There was a cutoff date at which a person could or could not be listed on the census. If the enumerator visited a home in which a baby had been born after the cutoff date, the baby would not be listed on the census. Similarly, if the enumerator visited a home in which a person had died after the cutoff date, that person would be listed.

The enumerators often had problems with penmanship and spelling. Phonetic spellings (Magloflin) and alternate forms of spelling (RIALS, RILES, ROYALS, RYALS, RYELS, RYLES) were often encountered. Readers who can not find a family name should try to think of other ways in which the name may have been creatively spelled.

In most cases, we have listed each name as the enumerator spelled it, whenever possible, but there have been many times when we made educated guesses. In the index, we endeavored to spell names correctly whenever possible. We want to thank Margery Neal Nelson for her help in identifying families in the Fruitland Peninsula.

Census records can be a great source of information; however, the reader must weigh the information, remembering the inaccuracies that may have occurred due to the enumerator's handwriting and spelling, illegible documents, or to our efforts to transcribe handwriting records. (Is it RUICK or RINCK?)

We hope this series of census transcriptions will aid persons who are interested in their ancestors more easily find those persons who lived here in Putnam County between 1850 and 1920. Use the index to find the family name, photocopy the page with family information, and use it to find the original page on microfilm containing the Putnam County census and check our interpretation of that page with your knowledge of your family.

The 1850 census is organized according to the following categories: 1. Households numbered in the order of visitation; 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation; 3. Name of every Person whose usual place of abode on the first day of June 1850 was in this family; 4. Age; 5. Sex; 6. Color, White, black or mulatto; 7. Profession, Occupation of each Male Person over 15 years of age; 8. Value of Real Estate owned; 9. Place of Birth, Naming the State, Territory or Country; 10. Married within the year; 11. Attended School within the year; 12. Persons over 20 years who cannot read or write; 13. Whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper, or convict.

The 1860 census is organized according to the following categories: 1. Dwelling houses, numbered in the order of visitation; 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation; 3. Name of every Person whose usual place of abode on the first day of June 1860 was in this family; 4. Age; 5. Sex; 6. Color, White, black or mulatto; 7. Profession, Occupation, or Trade of every person, male and female, over 15 years of age; Value of Real Estate Owned was divided into two categories: 8. Value of Real Estate; 9. Value of Personal Estate; 10. Place of Birth, Naming the State, Territory or Country; 11. Married within the year; 12. Attended School within the year; 13. Persons over 20 years who cannot read or write; 14. Whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane, idiotic, pauper, or convict.

The 1870 census is organized according to the following categories: 1. Dwelling houses, numbered in the order of visitation; 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation; 3. Name of every Person whose usual place of abode on the first day of June 1870 was in this family; 4. Age at last birthday–If under 1 year, give months in fractions, thus $\frac{3}{12}$; 5. Sex–Males

(M), Females (F); 6. Color—White (W), Black (B), Mulatto (M) Chinese (C), Indian (I); 7. Profession, Occupation of each person, male or female; 8. Value of Real Estate owned; 9. Value of Personal Estate; 10. Place of Birth, naming State or Territory of U.S.; or the Country, if of foreign birth; Parentage was marked 11. Father of foreign birth; 12. Mother of foreign birth; 13. If born within the year, state month (Jan., Feb., &c.); 14 If married within the year, state month (Jan., Feb., &c.); 15. Attended school within the year; 16. Cannot read; 17 Cannot write; 18. Whether deaf and dumb, blind, insane or idiotic; Constitutional Relations was the last category asking 19. Male Citizens of U.S. of 21 years of age and upwards; 20. Male Citizens of U.S. of 21 years of age and upwards whose right to vote is denied or abridged on other grounds than rebellion or other crime. Inquiries number 11, 12, 15, 16, 17, 19, and 20 were to be answered, if at all, merely by an affirmative mark, as /.

The largest problem with the 1870 census report is that individuals within a "family" are not identified as to the relationship. The reader does not know if the person is a member of the family, a servant, or some one who is just living in that household.

The 1880 Census began: Note A.—The Census Year begins on June 1, 1879 and ends May 31, 1880.

Note B stated "All persons will be included in the Enumeration who were living on the 1st day of June, 1880. No others will. Children BORN SINCE June 1, 1880, will be OMITTED, Members of families who have DIED SINCE June 1, 1880, will be INCLUDED.

Note C.—Questions Nos 12, 14, and 23 are not to be asked in respect to person under 10 years of age.

The census is organized according to the following categories: In Cities, Names of Street and House Numbers were to be given. 1. Dwelling houses, numbered in the order of visitation; and 2. Families numbered in the order of visitation;

3. Name of every Person whose usual place of abode on the first day of June 1880 was in this family.

Personal Description included; 4. Color—White W, Black B, Mulatto M, Chinese C, Indian I; 5. Sex—Males (M), Females (F); 6. Age at last birthday prior to June 1, 1880;—If under 1 year, give months in fractions, thus 3/12; 7. If born within the Census year, give the month; 8. Relationship of each person to the head of this family—whether wife, son, daughter, servant, boarder, or other;

Civil Condition was covered by 9. Single (/); 10. Married (/). 11. Widowed (/) or Divorced, D; 12. Married during Census year /;

Occupation asked 13. Profession, Occupation or Trade of each person, male or female; and 14. Number of months this person has been unemployed during the Census year.

Health information was recorded in 15. Is the person [on the day of the Enumerator's visit] sick or temporarily disabled, so as to be unable to attend to ordinary business or duties? If so, what is the sickness or disability? 16. Blind, /; 17. Deaf or Dumb, /; 18. Idiotic, /; 19. Insane, / 20. Maimed, Crippled, Bedridden, or otherwise disabled, / Education asked 21. Attended school within the Census year, /; 22. Cannot read, /; 23. Cannot write, /.

Nativity asked for 24. Place of Birth of this person, naming State or Territory of United State, or the Country, if of foreign birth. 25. Place of Birth of the FATHER of this person,, naming State or Territory of United State, or the Country, if of foreign birth. 25. Place of Birth of the MOTHER of this person,, naming State or Territory of United State, or the Country, if of foreign birth.

The 1885 Census began on June 1, 1884 and ended May 31, 1885. It was organized in the same order as the 1880 census asking for information that included: Name of Street; House Number; Dwelling house numbered; Families numbered; Names of each person; Color; Sex; Age; Month of birth during census year; Relationship of each person; Single; Married ; Widowed; Divorced; Married during Census year ; Profession, Occupation or Trade; Number of months unemployed during the Census year; Blind; Deaf or Dumb; Idiotic; Insane; Maimed, Crippled, Bedridden, or otherwise disabled; Attended school within the Census year; Cannot read; Cannot write; Place of Birth of this person; Place of Birth of the Father; Place of Birth of the Mother

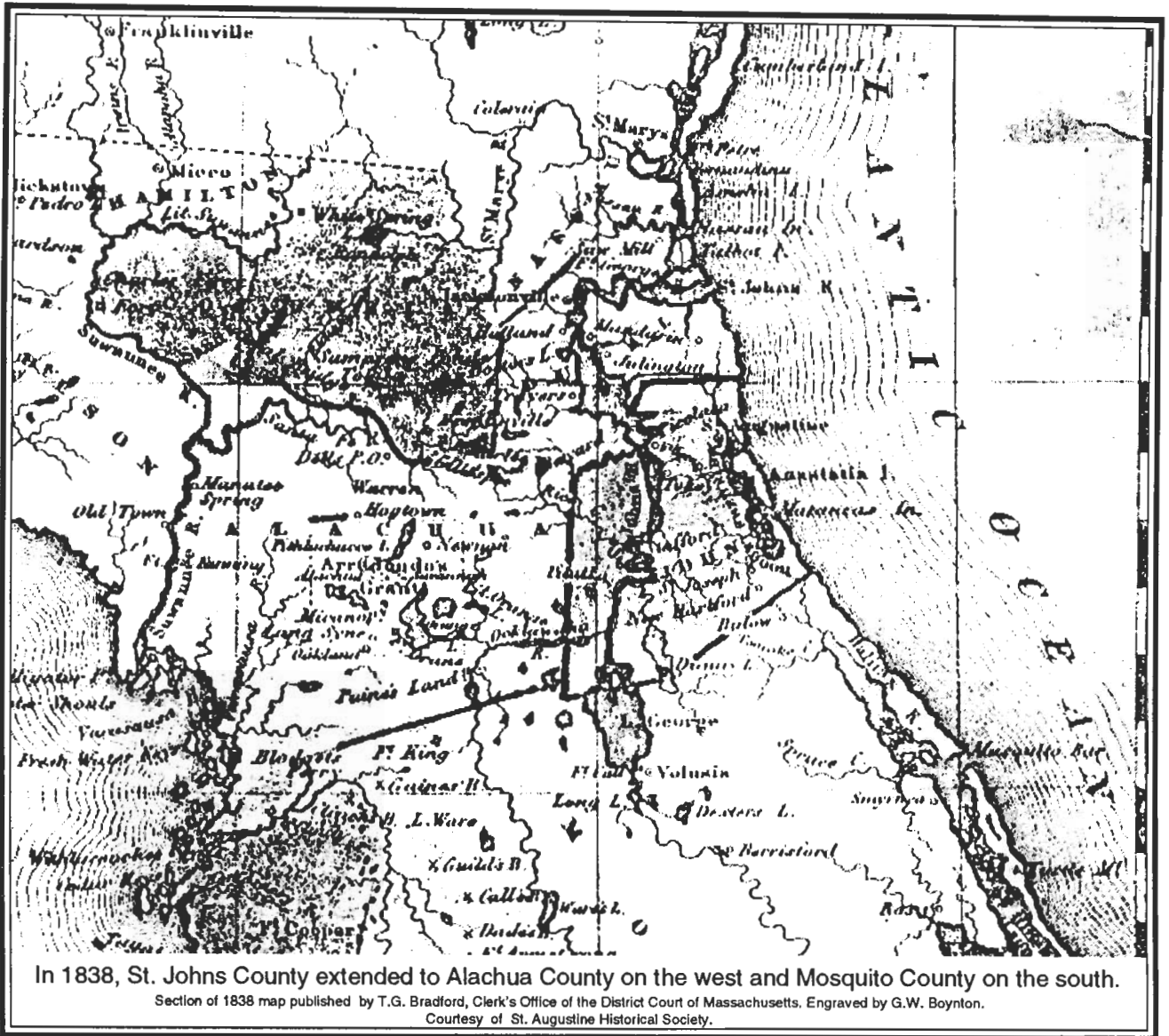

1850 Census



The Second Seminole War, 1835-1842, ended with over 3,000 Indians and Negroes being relocated in Arkansas while 1,500 soldiers died of wounds or disease. There was no estimate of civilian deaths.

In an effort to end the Indian uprisings, the Armed Occupation Act of 1842 was passed, providing three million acres of land, or 160 acres for family homesteads, to persons willing to reside for five years on land south of a line running east and west about three miles north of Palatka, and ten miles south of Newnansville in Alachua County.

Putnam County was created in 1849 and was only a small triangular area cut from St. Johns, Alachua, Marion and Duval Counties. The census taker notes at the end of his report, "The most of the inhabitants in this county have recently arrived from the states, and settled on Good Land under the pre-emption law which will acc[ess] for the small am[ount] of real estate emitted."

Land east of the St. Johns River, excepting the Fruitland Peninsula, was still part of St. Johns County and early land deeds may be found in that county.
