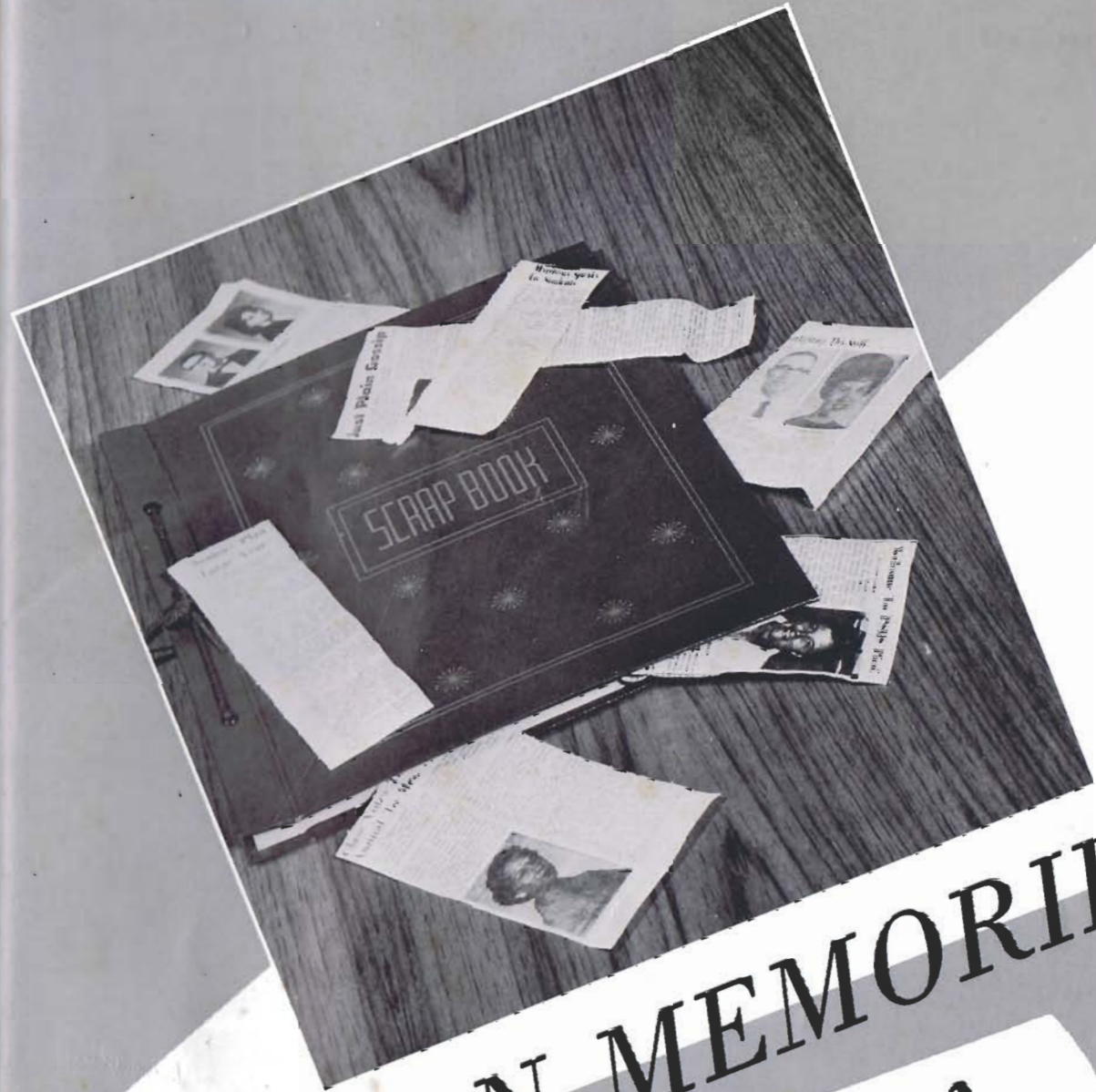

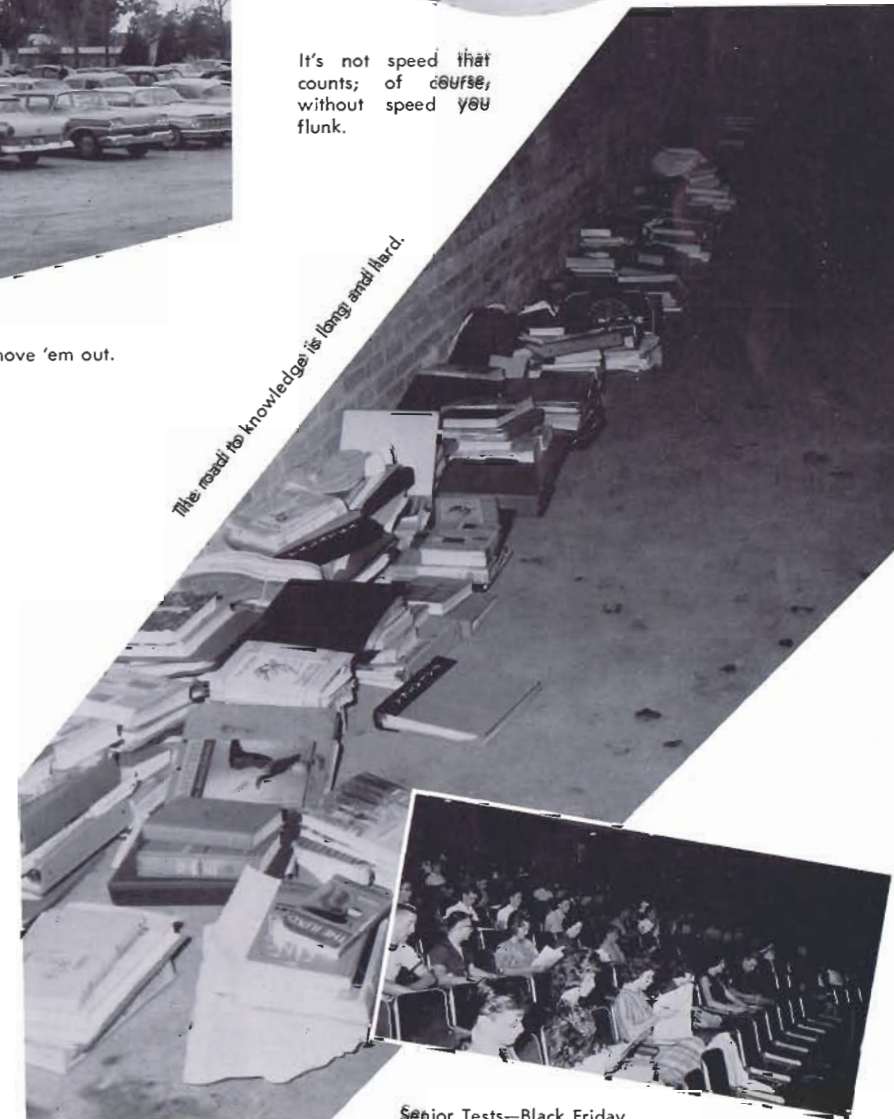

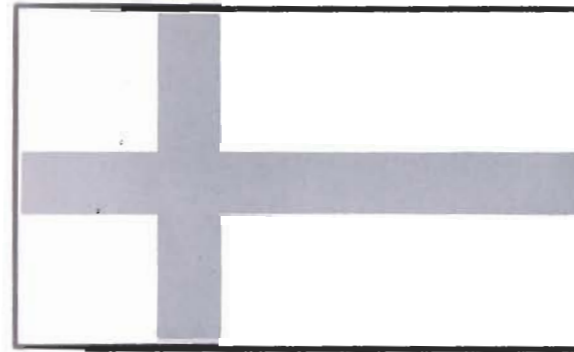


## Dedication
